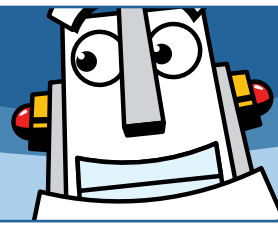

GET READY TO RECYCLE IN THE NEW YEAR!

After you recycle glass containers, they are crushed into cullet and melted to make new glass bottles and jars. What's cool about that? The containers don't end up in landfills! Finding ways to reuse your glass bottles and jars is also a good idea, as long as they don't end up in the trash. Here's a fun thing to do with used jars:







SNOW GLOBE JAR

What you'll need:

-  An empty glass baby food jar. You can also use something like a smaller salsa jar or short jelly jars. *Note: You'll need the lid too!*
-  Small toy, ornament or figurine.
-  Silver glitter for "snow."
-  Strong glue or hot glue (ask for help from an adult).



How to make the snow globe jar:

-  1. Peel off the jar labels. Wash and dry the jar very well.
-  2. Find a small toy or figurine that you'd like to place inside the snow globe jar. You can even use a small, winter-themed ornament. Just be sure it's something that won't get soggy or fall apart in water. Then glue the object to the underside of the lid using a strong glue or a hot glue gun (ask an adult for help with this!).
-  3. Next, sprinkle a pinch of glitter into the empty jar.
-  4. Then add water to the top.
-  5. Once the glue that holds the figurine to the lid has completely dried, place it down into the jar and screw the lid on tightly. A little water may spill out, that's okay.
-  6. Now you can flip the snow globe jar over shake it and watch the snow fall!



Thoughts: You can use many different objects inside the jar. Be creative and make a winter scene or make your own figurine out of Sculpey or some other polymer modeling clay. You can also tie a ribbon around the lid for a more festive look.
